**STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT**

The charity is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO) which was established on 6 March 2017.

The members of the SCIO are also the trustees. Trustees are appointed from time to time by majority vote and consist of not less than 3 and not more than 9 members at any time.

**OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

The charity's objectives and principal activities throughout the financial year were to promote the advancements of mental health and wellbeing in Scottish football and to raise awareness for the benefit of players, ex-players and staff connected to professional Scottish football clubs; including those clubs within the Scottish Professional Football League, the Scottish Highland League, the Scottish Lowland League, the Scottish Women's Premier League and associated youth academies.

The vision, mission and values statements for the charity are as follows:

*Our Vision*

Our vision is to dispel the stigma associated with mental health in Scottish professional football and for it to be integrated into physical health and fitness training programmes.

*Our Mission*

The Chris Mitchell Foundation will bring to the forefront the need for the awareness of mental health and wellbeing within the Scottish professional football industry, by sharing knowledge and skills and improve learning, forging cohesive and sustainable partnerships, connecting and supporting service users and campaigning to raise awareness on a national scale.

*Our Values*

**ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE**

The current strategic plan remains in place and as a result of the current and uncertain climate, has been extended for a further year until March 2022 and continues to set out the key aims and targets.

The key objectives of the Chris Mitchell Foundation are:

- Educating and Enabling
- Connecting and Supporting
- Engaging and Influencing
- Supporting Life After Football

Specific activities in the financial year included:

- Continued the strong working partnership with The Scottish Professional Football League Trust (SPFL Trust) and Positive Mental Health Scotland to fund the delivery of free bespoke Mental Health Awareness Training (MHAT) to club representatives from the Scottish Premier Football League (SPFL), Highland and Lowland Football League, Women's Premier League and Youth Academies.

The aims of the training are to:

- equip participants with the skills to provide initial support
- prevent the problem from getting worse
- provide participants with tools for giving comfort.

In fulfilling these aims, participants of the training are able to meet the following objectives:

- talk about suicide
  - recognise the signs of mental health problems
  - provide initial help and how to guide a person to appropriate help.
- Between November 2020 and May 2021, we funded the delivery of 14 MHAT courses, of which 13 took place online and one took place face-to-face at Dundee United FC.

A total of 157 participants took part in the course, representing 104 organisations including: local authorities, football clubs, their associated community trusts and other third sector organisation connected to the football world.

Participants came from a broad range of backgrounds including: players, coaches, chaplains, club secretaries, physiotherapists, ticketing managers and other operational staff from clubs.

- Supported a number of students and journalists with interviews focusing on the issues surrounding mental health of footballers in the professional game.
- Participated in a number of high-profile national media and newspaper and radio interviews promoting the work of the foundation and the importance of positive mental health and wellbeing.
- Engaged with a number of local secondary schools to highlight Chris' story and the work of the foundation as part of their mental health week campaigns and Youth Philanthropy Initiative Scotland.

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- Sponsored Stirling Albion Junior Academy Football team, with the charity logo proudly displayed on the team, strip to help raise awareness of positive mental health and wellbeing within grassroots football.
- Invited to sit on the Scottish FA Mental Health Advisory Panel. The purpose of the panel is to provide advice and guidance on all Mental Health and Wellbeing matters to ensure that practical, strategic and operational support is sustained through the development and delivery of the Association's Football Unites; Mental Health Action Plan.

The objectives of the Scottish FA Mental Health Advisory Panel are to support the Scottish FA in its delivery of its Mental Health Action Plan by providing opportunities for discussion and debates on possible actions to provide the best support to Scottish Football through the Mental Health Action Plan outcomes. Creation of Mental Health and Wellbeing Networks which can support the development of opportunities to support Scottish Football Act as advocates for the Scottish FA's work within Mental Health and Wellbeing in National and International settings. Serve as channels of professional advice within the areas of expertise represented on the Advisory Panel and offer fresh insights and identify new opportunities.

- To mark five years of MHAT we partnered up with the SPFLT to develop a new film about the impact of Chris' legacy: 'Mitch: What Happened Next'. The film picks up from Chris' story and explains the impact Chris' legacy has had on Scottish football through the MHAT. The film featured Chris' dad, Philip and Chris' friend and Rangers star Scott Arfield and three different training participants. Since releasing the film we have seen high levels of engagement and a 20% increase in demand for places on the course.

**FINANCIAL REVIEW**

The amount retained in Unrestricted Funds at the period end is £50,485 (2020: £63,433). The deficit for the year was £12,948 (2020: £34,942 surplus).

### Independent Examiner's Report to the Management Committee of CHRIS MITCHELL FOUNDATION

I report on the accounts of Chris Mitchell Foundation for the year ended 31 March 2021 which are set out on pages 8 to 11.

#### Respective responsibilities of Management Committee members and examiner

The Management Committee is responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. The Management Committee considers that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the financial statements as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

#### Basis of independent examiner's statement

### Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2021

#### 1. Accounting policies

a) Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and under the historical cost convention, modified as to reflect the inclusion of income and expenditure on a receipts and payments (i.e. cash) basis, and in accordance with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

b) Incoming Resources

All income and donations are included within receipts under either unrestricted or restricted funds according to the terms under which the income is received or the donation is made.

c) Resources Expended

Expenditure is recognised on a cash basis as payment is made.

Governance costs comprise accountancy expenses and other professional fees.

d) Funds structure

The incoming resources of the charity are from unrestricted sources and as such all funds are presented as unrestricted.

e) Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life. Rates used are as follows:-

The nature and purpose of each fund is as follows:-

**a) Unrestricted**

General Fund

The purpose of this fund is to meet all legitimate expenses incurred on behalf of Chris Mitchell Foundation.

Designated Fund

The purpose of this fund is to meet the cost of delivering planned mental health training to club representatives through the SPFL Trust.
